She has also lived and worked in Italy, Spain, France, Russia, Cyprus, and Austria with organisations including the Guggenheim, Sotheby's, the Carabinieri, Acciona Cultura, Associated Press, The Guardian, and the BBC.

Whenever possible, Elisa mentors people interested in cultural careers, draws, writes and contributes to conferences and films. Her main research interests and publications cover solidarity, memorials, and the role of the artist in communities undergoing or emerging from oppression or conflict, for which she founded the Rise-Rosa-Rage Archive of Socio-Political Graphics in 2016.

Elisa has a degree in Modern Languages from the University of Cambridge and a Masters in Contemporary Art and Politics from the Courtauld Institute of Art, London.
