BARRY LORD, LL.D. Co-President (1939-2017)



Barry Lord was internationally known as one of the world's leading museum planners. Dedicated, thorough and knowledgeable, having begun his museum career at the National Gallery of Canada while still an undergraduate, Barry brought over 50 years of experience in the management and planning of museums, galleries and historic sites to the hundreds of projects he directed. Educated at McMaster and Harvard Universities in Philosophy and the History and Philosophy of Religion, Barry planned and managed cultural and heritage projects that range from marine archaeology to industrial

technology and from heritage villages to the complex stories of a nation. His profound knowledge of planning for art museums stemed from his early work as an art curator, critic and educator. He held positions as curator, education officer and director at several art galleries and museums in Canada and curated freelance exhibitions for Canadian and American galleries.

As an author and editor, Barry was originally known for artscanada magazine (1967), and for The History of Painting in Canada: Toward a People's Art (1974), as well as numerous exhibition catalogues, art magazine articles and newspaper art criticism. More recently, together with Gail Lord, Barry edited and wrote the world's first book on the subject, Planning Our Museums (Ottawa, 1983), and what is now considered the guide book in the profession. The Manual of Museum Plannina, which appeared originally in 1991 but has been so universally popular that it is now in its 3rd edition, AltaMira Press, 2012 (co-edited with Gail Dexter Lord and Lindsay Martin). The Manual of Museum Management (TSO, London, 1997; 2nd edition, AltaMira Press, 2009) followed, co-authored by Gail and Barry Lord. The Manual of Museum Exhibitions originally appeared in 2002, but again has been so widely used by designers, teachers and students that it is now in its 2nd edition (AltaMira Press, 2014), co-edited by Barry and Maria Piacente. Barry was one of the three authors of *The Cost of Collecting* (TSO, London, 1989), a landmark study in collection management costs, and both wrote and edited The Manual of Museum Learning (2007), published also by AltaMira Press. In 2010 Gail and Barry collaborated to write Artists, Patrons, and the Public: Why Culture Changes (AltaMira Press, 2010). Barry's last book was Art & Energy, published by The AAM Press of The American Alliance of Museums and distributed by the University of Chicago Press. Many of these books are being successfully used in university museum studies, cultural studies or exhibition design programs.

Barry's international reputation as President of Lord Cultural Resources, which he and Gail founded in 1981, was reflected by his many invitations to speak at conferences and seminars from Seoul to Zagreb, at the 2008 and 2012 Vienna Artweeks and at the 2013 International Conference on Sustainable Heritage Preservation at Roma 3 University in Rome. Having previously lectured in art history in both English and French at leading Canadian universities, he taught frequently in museum management, planning and training programs at universities and museum organizations around the world.

Barry directed many of Lord Cultural Resources' Functional Briefs or Programs and related Facility Strategies for museums, having developed a unique approach to zoning museum spaces and a comprehensive, systematic approach to space planning and functional requirements for museums. He also directed hundreds of master plans, feasibility studies, collection analyses and exhibition planning, design and installation projects for museums around the world.
